Nakasendo Post Road Tour

The Nakasendo Post Road tour is a fully escorted tour with a bilingual tour leader suitable for anyone who is an occasional walker who can walk from 7 to 24km in a day. In general, the route is gently undulating but also includes some short, steeper climbs along a mix of lanes, gravel tracks, forest paths, cobbled roadway and bitumen. A 12 night 11 day tour beginning in Kyoto and finishing in Tokyo. Tour accommodation is in a mix of Japanese business style hotels, traditional onsen hotels and traditional ryokan or minshuku.

What is the Nakasendo Way?

The Nakasendo Post Road literally translates as “the road through the mountains”. It is an ancient post route that links the ancient capital Kyoto with Tokyo via the Japanese Alps.

In its heyday dating back to the 7th century the Nakasendo was bustling with feudal lords, samurai, merchants, and pilgrims. However, in modern day it is a largely forgotten and eerily quiet route through the mountains. The post road provides a pleasant and picturesque path through scenic country side and a journey into Japan’s feudal past, studded with Shinto shrines, statues of deities charged with watching over travellers and many points of interest. We pass through and stop over in some of the picturesque post towns dotted along the route that have somehow survived until modern times, much in the same way as travellers of old used to do.
